There are many things that you may want to ask when your child begins nursery

Here are the answers to a number of frequently asked questions.

What if my child is sick?

- We ask that children are not sent to nursery unless fit and well enough to participate in all normal activities.
- If your child is unwell we ask that you contact the school office as soon as possible explaining the reason for absence.
- If your child is taken ill at school or has an accident, the school will notify you or a nominated contact as soon as possible.

My child has allergies, what should I do?

- Please inform the school of any allergies your child has. THIS IS VERY IMPORTANT.
- If your child develops an allergy or school information requires updating, please inform the school office as soon as possible.

What if the weather is bad?

• During times of inclement weather, children are supervised in their classrooms during break times. If there is snow, we will keep all parents updated using the text messaging service, our school website and twitter account.

Can my child bring sweets, toys or valuables to school?

- Children are not allowed to bring toys or valuables to school. This prevents arguments over ownership and removes any temptation to take other's property.
- As a health promoting school we do not allow sweets in school, children may purchase fruit, milk and toast during the mid-morning break as a healthy snack.

What if my child has a dental / medical appointment and will be late arriving?

• Where possible, the school Office Manager and class teacher should be informed the day before the appointment.

What if I need to see the nursery staff?

• There may be occasions when you wish to speak to a member of the nursery team. In these circumstances please contact the school office and an appointment will be made at the earliest convenience or arrange a time with the class teacher after school.

At Gentleshaw we take pride in wearing our school uniform and ensuring that we look smart at all times. We expect all children to wear the agreed school uniform.

In Summer

In the events of accidents we will provide alternative clothing, which should be washed and returned to school.

No jewellery should be worn to school, only stud earrings may be worn.

We ask for all long hair to be tied back for school.

Getting Ready for Nursery

We want your child to feel happy and secure in their first days of nursery. As you will appreciate it is helpful to us and gives confidence to your child, if they can do certain things for themselves. These might include:

- Go to the toilet by themselves and wash their hands afterwards.
- Put on their coat and do it up.
- Put their own shoes on. We know shoelaces are difficult, the buckles can be too, but if they can have a go they will feel good about themselves.
