3. Barriers to Attainment for Pupil Premium Pupils

- O Due COVID 19 and the school closures Pupil Premium Pupils have missed a significant amount of their education. PP families were offered time for their children to attend school during the closure but only 2 out of the 12 families accepted this.
- o A high proportion of the Pupil Premium Pupils have specific learning and/or behavioural needs, which affect academic progress and attainment. 42% of Pupil Premium Pupils are on the SEN Register or 'On Watch'.
- o Pupil Premium Pupils are not attaining as well as other pupils in reading, writing and maths.
- o Cost can be a barrier and reduces the opportunity/financial resources for extra-curricular & enrichment activities such additional clubs; visits and residential trips.
- o A number of Pupil Premium pupils have social and emotional issues and as a result receive support from in school and outside agencies. In some instances, this adversely impacts upon aspirations and self-esteem, learning behaviours, progress and attainment.
- o The attendance of Pupil Premium Pupils is less than that of non-pupil premium pupils with punctuality being an issue amongst some Pupil Premium Pupils.
